Dr. Silvia De Bianchi is a Ramón y Cajal fellow at the Autonomous University of Barcelona (UAB). After receiving her PhD in Philosophy from the University of Rome "La Sapienza", she worked as a post-doc in the UK (University College London), Germany (Siegen University and TU Dortmund) and France (ENS Paris). In 2014, she moved to Barcelona and worked as a Marie Curie fellow at the Centre for the History of Science of the UAB. In 2017, she joined the Department of Philosophy as a Ramón y



Cajal fellow. Her research interests cover epistemological questions emerging in Immanuel Kant's philosophy and natural science, as well as in Hermann Weyl's scientific and philosophical works. She is interested in developing methodologies that integrate the history and philosophy of science and in exploring how models work in scientific practice. As Principal Investigator, she is currently leading a multidisciplinary research team on the ERC-STG project "Paradoxes and Metaphors of Time in Early Universe(s)" (PROTEUS), 2018-2023, which investigates different cosmological models and their implications for the philosophy of time and metaphysics.
